




### 75th International Convention (IC-2026) – Dubai Awaits Us!

Dubai is calling; let's answer with pride and purpose.



# TIME OF FAST POLICIES & GUIDELINES 2025 EDITION



### Time of Fast (TOF): A Global YMI Program

Time of Fast (TOF) is a flagship initiative of Y's Men International, launched in 1969 to support YMCA's refugee work. It became an official program in 1972 and has since raised over 6 million CHF (~7 million USD) for development and disaster relief projects.

### **Funding & Contributions**

TOF is funded through voluntary donations, with members traditionally forgoing one meal in February and donating its cost. Contributions are welcome year-round and submitted with club donations.

Use of TOF Funds

### Funds are allocated to:

- Project support (up to CHF 15,000)
- Disaster relief
- Administrative costs

### **Project Payment Schedule**

Unless otherwise approved:

- 15% Upon request and banking details
- 35% After first progress report
- 35% After second progress report
- 15% After final report

#### **Administration**

10% of annual TOF income supports program administration, leadership, and promotion. The TOF Committee Chair (TOFCC) attends Assembly meetings for review and reporting.

IP Discretionary Relief Fund

CHF 5,000 annually is allocated for emergency response at the discretion of the International President, in consultation with the Executive Committee.

Leadership Structure

### The TOF Committee includes:

- One Area representative (voting member)
- The TOFCC (if from the Area, also serves as its rep)
- One YMCA-nominated member

Eligibility & Selection

### To apply for TOF funding, clubs must:

- Be in good standing
- Have contributed to TOF in the prior year

### **Selection Process:**

- Applications submitted online (in English)
- Reviewed by TOFCC and IHQ
- Feedback gathered from Areas/Regions
- Final evaluation by TOF Committee based on eligibility and feedback

### **Key TOF Dates**

- 15 Aug Application opens
- 15 Nov Deadline
- 30 Nov 28 Feb Review, evaluation & committee ranking
- 15 June Final report to Legislative Assembly

### Introducing one of the oldest club in the Central Travancore Region

### "50 Years of YMC Chengannur":

The Y's Men's Club of Chengannur, founded in 1975 amid a period of decline in the local YMCA, has grown into a highly active and impactful organization committed to service, leadership development, and community engagement. Originating within the broader Y's Men International movement (founded in 1922 in the USA and formally established in India in 1940), the Chengannur club played a key role in reviving the local YMCA and has continuously supported its goals.



Over the past five decades, the club has implemented numerous community service projects such as constructing the YMCA auditorium, providing homes for the homeless, improving sanitary conditions in hospitals, conducting medical and blood donation camps, and supporting education and self-employment initiatives. It also constructed public utilities like waiting sheds and telephone booths, and organized regular inter-school cultural and literary competitions.

YMC Chengannur has produced leaders at all levels of the Y's Men movement, including District Governors, Regional Directors, and Area Presidents. Club members have received various international recognitions and awards for leadership, transparency, and service. The club has also successfully formed many extension clubs across India and abroad.

A strong Y's Menettes club and Y's Lings (youth) club complement the club's service efforts and have earned multiple awards in their own right.

Through its sustained commitment and active involvement, the Y's Men's Club of Chengannur remains a strong and respected pillar of the Y's Men International movement and continues to make a significant contribution to society.

# Kumamoto, the City of Water

Kumamoto, known as the "Land of Fire," is also a "city of water," blessed with pure groundwater that supplies all of its tap water — a rare pride in Japan. The historic Tsūjunkyō aqueduct, built in the Edo period, still fascinates visitors, reflecting the city's deep connection with water. Strolling through Kumamoto reveals its clear springs, waterways, and a culture beautifully shaped by the harmony of volcanoes and water.

### Y's Men Activities in Kumamoto

The 31st Asia Pacific Area Convention was held from August 1–3, 2025, at Kumamoto-Jo Hall & Hotel Nikko Kumamoto, bringing together over 580 Y's Men from across Asia, Europe, and the Americas. Preceding this, 39 youth delegates attended the 5-day Asia Pacific Youth Convocation (July 30–Aug 3) at ASO YMCA Camp, hosted by Kumamoto YMCA.

### Must-Visit Destinations

### Mount Aso - enjoy nature and relaxation.

The course showcased Aso's beauty — from the serene Shirakawa Water Source and vast grasslands of Kusasenri to a local buffet at Aso Farmland, ending with stunning views of the Five Peaks from Daikanpou Observation Deck. A day filled with nature, flavor, and unforgettable moments.
